On the mausoleum where the body of Martin Luther King, Jr. lies, is the inscription, "Free At Last!" When Jesus promised "the Son sets free," He was referring not just to liberty in this world, (where at times even the best of Christians feels trapped in particular circumstances) but to eternity when those who are believers in Him will experience freedom forever and ever...

Jesus promised He is coming again, and our earthly and eternal hope is caught up in the truth of our Lord's promise. Yes, I find hope even in our "opportunities" because I know that when we put a positive spin on things life is so much better!! I need hope and I find it in my faith walk-with you!

Thank you again for the honor and privilege to serve as your interim pastor. Thank you for your support and especially for your prayers for Susan as she battles cancer. This week (9/24) she received her third chemo infusion, one more to go and then radiation. Your thoughtfulness and support are making a wonderful difference for both of us. I look forward to having my wife back in worship as soon as possible!!

I close with the words to a song that speaks to my heart:

When King Jesus comes to live with us again He will show His righteous love to every man Wars and strife will all be passed there'll be peace on earth at last When King Jesus comes to live with us again.

Come soon, King Jesus, come soon . . . until then, keep us watchful, waiting and working together in your vineyard. Amen.
